

Budget Report for June 2022

Finance reported for the month of June 2022. Income from tithes and offerings was \$19,057.88, and our expenses were \$22,642.28. Total cash flow for the month was negative \$3,584.40. (June is when we pay our quarterly insurance premium of \$3,553.00).

Endowment Report

Current value of the Endowment fund is \$114,219.98 based on 5,526.5083 shares at \$20.668 per share as of June 30, 2022.

The Fund is currently invested in a Diversified Fund with 70% of the investments in equity and 30% in fixed income. The fund is managed by the United Methodist Foundation of Western North Carolina.

The fund pays a dividend each quarter with dividends purchasing more shares of the fund. Dividends/Expenses for this year (2022) per quarter are:

Dividends are paid each quarter:

Quarter 1 – January. Quarter 2 – April. Quarter 3 – July. Quarter 4 – October.

The current economic conditions have played a major part of the Endowment Fund's value. The value of the fund is down approximately \$24,230.00 since January 1, 2022.

We United Methodists have a long, rich heritage of each of the four memories you may have of God, Family, Friends, and Faith. United Methodists enjoy a rich history, one steeped in Scripture, tradition, and faith.

United Methodists' roots include people who for more than 2000 years have followed Jesus.

A few centuries ago, John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, defined Methodists as, "a people who profess to pursue (in whatsoever measure they have attained) holiness of heart and life...in a steady imitation of Him they worship... in justice, mercy, and truth, or universal love filling the heart, and governing the life."

As we go into the world, we do so with an appreciation for our heritage and strive to model our abiding faith to others.

God: In our own individual understanding that forms our belief of creation, life, and love.

Family: Those who gave us nourishment, security, and love.

Friends: Those who meet us, accept us, and love us as we are.

Faith: What do we believe about God, Family, Friends, and Ourselves that makes us realize we can do what others think may be impossible if we love ourselves enough to try?

As I reflect on these things, I am reminded that our Church family is vital to the strongest and the weakest of us. It takes all of us to make our life complete in the sight of God who created us in His image.

Closing thoughts: Do you feel loved by God, Family, and Friends, and is your Faith strong enough to sustain you when the storms of life attack us?

Methodist History (Morals & Theology)

Note: This is the second of three articles on religious (spiritual) education.

Proverbs 1:8 Listen to your father's instructions and do not forsake your mother's teachings. Proverbs 2:10 For wisdom will enter your heart, and moral knowledge will be attractive to you. 2nd Timothy 1:7 For God hath not given us the spirit of fear but of a sound [secure] mind.

Last month's article covered centuries of oral training/learning from parents. While most were day-to-day instructions, spiritual education started to emerge concurrently with Abraham arriving in the land of the Canaanites. My perspective will be using the Abrahamic religions. After presenting one more very special Biblical era person, second to fourteenth century apologists will be skipped to "stay out of the briar patch."

Jesus of Nazareth directly taught God's word against the wishes of the Jewish priests. In AD 27-28, Jesus selected twelve students to be his "school" using a method later used by Buddha and made famous by the Greeks. They stayed with him as he traveled, observing and listening to his talks. He used stories and parables, many of which generated more questions for lively discussions. He also spoke before large crowds. Yet, his students only later in life grasped his message to practice and teach moral and spiritual principles "to all nations." After the Dark Ages, many individuals challenged the status quo demanding better Christian education, especially for the children. Three individuals are highlighted here.

Martin Luther (1483-1546) may have generated as much influence on Christian education as did his more famous 95 theses. He translated the Greek language Bible into colloquial German, bypassing the need for parish priests to "interpret" God's word. Remember, indulgences? He challenged the right of only the Catholic Church to educate the populous, advocating for public schools. Luther's written explanations for Christian precepts (e.g., Lord's Prayer, baptism) are still used today. He advocated a balanced approach in education between mind and heart [spirit] for all, including girls.

John Comenius (1592-1670) is better known as the "Founder of Modern Education." Yet his work in Christian education stands on its own merit. He was an ordained Bishop and organized schools throughout Europe with a balance between secular and religious education. In his book, *The School of Infancy*, he advocated mothers should pro-actively engage children, ages one thru six, in lessons of life and knowledge. One of his three key reasons for advocating reading skills was to give the child the ability to directly read and study the Bible. Locally, the Comenius Foundation carries on his tradition.

Hannah Ball (1734-1792) shares credit for developing the modern Sunday School format with Mr. Robert Raikes, who several years later implemented a similar program used widely in England. Christian education was not part of the original Methodist movement. On learning of her program John Wesley strongly supported her. One of his sermons was entitled "On the Education of Children." She provided general education for the community's poor always focusing on Christian principles during Sunday session and Monday evening sessions. Without her effort, many children would not have received any formal education as children of the poor often worked 12 hours per day six days a week.

For over two thousand years, the history of Christian education has been one of benign neglect and rebirth. While each renewal had been on children's Biblical knowledge, the nineteenth century included adult education with a focus on developing wisdom to better discern God's meaning for our lives. Next month, a view of contemporary Christian education viewed from the mountain top using survey data will wrap up this three-part series.

Note from the Cemetery Committee


